PHARMACOLOGICAL PRINCIPLES.

Psychopharmacology, one of the most active and developing areas of psychiatric research, is the use of psychotropic medication to treat psychiatric disorders. Psychiatric-mental health nurse practitioners (PMHNPs) must have a thorough understanding of the science and art of prescribing—of the pharmacokinetic and pharmacodynamic actions of a given drug, as well as the client's motivation to take the drug.

PHARMACOLOGICAL PRINCIPLES

Before going into the drugs that are primarily used for psychiatric patients, we will first tackle the pathophysiology. You have to keep in mind that before you know the mechanism of each type of drug, you must first know what it affects. So, let's get into it.
